

LEADR well represented on NADRAC

After recent changes to the National Alternative Dispute Resolution Advisory Council (NADRAC), there continues to be four LEADR members on the Council.

LEADR Advanced mediator, Stephen Lancken is one of four new appointments to the National Alternative Dispute Resolution Advisory Council (NADRAC).

Stephen Lancken is the Australian Principal of the Trillium Group and also an Adjunct Lecturer in Conflict Management at the University of New South Wales.

Professor Tania Sourdin, a LEADR Advanced mediator and LEADR lead trainer has been re-appointed, while LEADR Advanced member Mr John Spender QC is one of three members of the Council who have retired this year.

NADRAC is an independent non-statutory body providing advice to the Attorney-General about alternative dispute resolution.

LEADR is pleased to see LEADR members being recognized in this way. "We are also happy that ADR practitioners of such stature are representing the interests of ADR," said Fiona Hollier, LEADR CEO.

The other LEADR members on the Council are Dr Gaye Sculthorpe, a full time member of the National Native Title Tribunal, and Professor Nadja Alexander, a Professor of Dispute Resolution at the Australian Centre for Peace and Conflict Studies, University of

Queensland and an Adjunct Professor at Murdoch University

In addition to Mr Lancken, the other three new appointments announced by Attorney-General Robert McClelland were Mr John Hodgins, Mr Tom Howe QC and Ms Lindsay Smith.

"These new members will make a valuable and broad ranging contribution to NADRAC's work, including through promoting the use and profile of alternative dispute resolution," said Mr McClelland.

Mr Warwick Soden has been re-appointed and Ms Josephine Akee AM, and Ms Lynn Stephen have retired from the Council.

The Council has been very active in fostering the development of the new industry National Mediator Accreditation System.

The new appointments are for three year terms.

Biographies of NADRAC appointees

Mr Stephen Lancken

Stephen Lancken is the Australian Principal of the Trillium Group. He is also an Adjunct Lecturer in Conflict Management at the University of New South Wales. Mr Lancken is a member of the New South Wales Law Society's Dispute Resolution Committee. He is an accredited mediator under the National Mediator Accreditation System and an accredited mediation specialist with the Law Society of New South Wales.

Professor Tania Sourdin

Professor Tania Sourdin is Professor of Law and Dispute Resolution and Director of Conflict Resolution and Practice, Australian Centre for Peace and Conflict Studies, University of Queensland. From 2002-2007, she was Professor of Law and Dispute Resolution and Director of the Conflict Resolution Research Centre at La Trobe University. Professor Sourdin is a part-time member of the Administrative Appeals Tribunal.

Mr John Hodgins

John Hodgins is a magistrate based in Cairns. Prior to his appointment as a magistrate, he was the Chief Executive Officer of Legal Aid Queensland. He was formerly a member of the Steering Committee Reviewing Aboriginal Legal Services, a member of the Family Law Council and a member of the Council of the Australian Institute of Judicial Administration.

Mr Tom Howe QC

Tom Howe QC is the Chief Counsel, Litigation at the Australian Government Solicitor (AGS), where he has worked for the last 22 years. Prior to joining AGS, he worked in private practice and as a solicitor with ACT Legal Aid. He is a member of the Australian Corporate Lawyers Association, the Federal Litigation Section of the Law Council, and the ACT Bar Association.

Ms Lindsay Smith

Lindsay Smith is the Acting Executive Manager for the Dispute Resolution Branch of the Queensland Department of Justice and Attorney-General.
